NetLibrary is a service that allows you to download and play audio books on your computer or compatible mp3 player. Search the catalog of thousands of titles available through Meridian Library District's subscription to listen to books at home, on the road, or in the gym. What's good is a database?

Databases may be intimidating at first. There are dozens of options to choose from, search screens are far more cluttered than Google, and even the basic searches offer far more options than you'll find on the home page of most internet search engines. For someone new to EBSCO or ProQuest, the prospect of searching can be overwhelming.

One advantage of using a database is that you have access to detailed, authoritative information that isn't available through standard internet searches. You'll find full-text articles that have undergone an editorial and peer-review process. You'll be able to search years of newspaper articles using any criteria you choose. You can find book reviews, information on career choices, and even download audio books to your mp3 player.

Only a few years ago, access to material of this kind would have required hundreds of dollars in subscriptions or hours spent at the library. Now it's online. To start using LiLI, the Idaho Commission for Libraries asks that you register with an email address, the name of your local library, city, and zip code. Your information remains confidential and is not shared with any third parties.

NoveList

Your Guide to Fiction powered by EBSCOhost

NoveList serves as a source for what librarians call readers' advisory: the practice of helping library patrons discover new authors and genres they may never have found otherwise. NoveList includes lists of major award winners, reading guides, book club discussion guides, and general recommendations from librarians around the country.

Every entry for a novel includes a plot summary as well as brief reviews from sources like Booklist and Publishers' Weekly. Also included are subject headings similar to what you might find in a standard library record, read-alikes that suggest similar kinds of writers, and other books that might be associated with the title, all geared toward helping you decide whether or not a given book is something you'd enjoy.
